



Here at ESIS we are lucky enough to have students from over thirty-five different countries. The Multicultural Fair is a way to celebrate the diversity of cultures we have here at the school!

Goals:

You will become more familiar with other cultures here at ESIS and will have a chance to celebrate these cultures.

What will you do?

1. Make a poster.

You will research the region and culture of your country and you this information to create a poster about your country. Each student will create a poster. Be sure to communicate with students from your country to not repeat information!

Your poster may contain information such as the following:

- Your country and region
- Culture
- Festivities
- Typical Foods, products, or resources
- Typical clothing
- Important people
- An important author from your country
- A short history
- Current affairs

You may include other factual information that you think might be interesting or important. Please check with your teacher if you have additional ideas!

Be sure to keep it simple and visual! Put lots of pictures!

2. Make a language sign.

You will create a small poster the following words in your language: Hello, good afternoon, how are you, have a nice day, thank you. (you may add more if you like!)

Be sure to put the translation in English and to also write it phonetically if necessary! Example:

Japanese

こんにちは Konnichiwa *Ko-nee-chee-wa* "Hello"

3. Bring food.

You will prepare a typical food from your country. Foods that can be easily transported work best! *Example: Italy = pizza, Japan= sushi, Spain = cold cuts. You can also bring typical cake, candy, etc.*

4. Have typical products of your country on display.

The fair will be held after Spring Break, so if you go back to your home country, you might want to bring something back with you for the fair.

Examples: souvenirs, objects, typical clothing, models, etc. You can also wear special clothing, such as typical clothing or a tee-shirt representing your country. Other mediums can be such, such as power points, music, or dance.

5. Put a map and/or flag.

Bring one big map of your country to place on the wall or on the table.

6. Make invitations.

Students will make invitations to invite their coaches, family members, or anyone else they would like to partake in the celebration.

7. Communicate with your teammates.

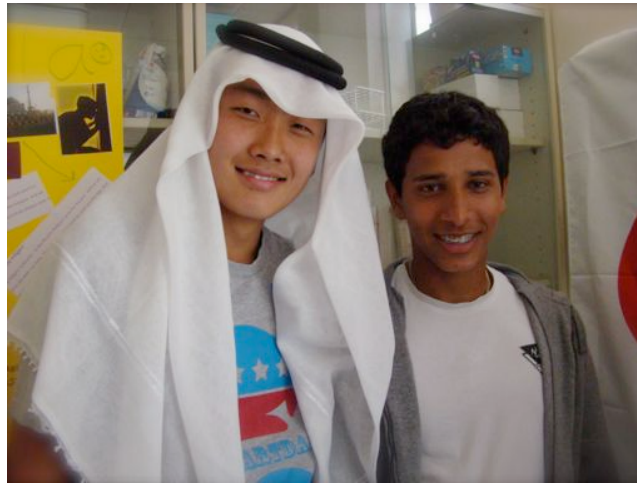
Be sure to work as a team and communicate with each other. Your teachers will give you several days to work together. Take advantage of this time and use your time wisely!

8. Be creative!

You may bring anything else that you think might represent your country. Check with your teacher to be sure!

What will happen the day of the fair?

(Tentative Date: Friday, April 12)



- Students will quickly set up their area before lunch with other students from their team.
- Students will present their country together with other students from their country during 5th and 6th period (12:10-13:45). *Tentative place: Carpa Pequeña.*
- The entire school will be invited, including coaches, family members! *(Be sure to give invitations to those who you would like to invite!)*
- Students will be asked questions by the judges about their posters and their country. *(Be prepared and confident! Be sure to practice what you will say and to make eye contact!)*
- Be sure to stay by your table. If you are not there, the judges cannot judge you!
- There will winners! This year the judges will be chosen. They will choose: The best country, The best region, and also a surprise winner!
